EARLY YEARS EDUCATION DIPLOMA — RICHMOND

TRANSFORMATIVE TEACHING AND LEARNING PRACTICES with Kindergarten and Primary Children

PROGRAM DESIGN

The program is composed of 10 courses (30-credits) delivered over six terms. The program is designed to fit the needs and schedules of working teachers and early childhood professionals, combining face-to-face courses in Richmond, with online course options.

Courses are taught by a knowledgeable and experienced team administered by UBC's Institute for Early Childhood Education & Research.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- Participants develop a community of inquiry and network of support with peers and instructors.
- The off-campus program allows teachers to achieve a 30-credit diploma within two years.
- Teachers who complete the EYE Diploma can apply to **Teacher Qualification Service** (TQS) for a qualification upgrade.
- Teachers who complete five ECED courses can apply to obtain a Certificate in Educating Young Children.

YEAR ONE

ECED 480A

EARLY LEARNING IN NATURAL PLAYSCAPES

This course focuses on children's engagement with Nature and draws on theory and research that focuses on placebased pedagogy, developing relationships with the natural environment, and outdoor spaces as contexts for rich learning, deep thinking, and critical reflection.

ECED 480B

INOUIRY-INSPIRED PROJECT BASED LEARNING

In this course, educators will address the importance of supporting children's natural curiosities and inquiries, including the relevance of drawing on children's expertise of local and global contexts.

ECED 421

SUPPORTING YOUNG CHILDREN THROUGH HOME, SCHOOL, AND COMMUNITY RELATIONSHIPS

This course explores the ways that children's broader social networks can be authentically included in early years' programs to support children's holistic development. We will specifically reflect on the ways children's social and emotional learning can be supported in a collaborative and engaging community of learners.

YEAR TWO

ECED 438

OBSERVATION AND DOCUMENTATION

This course shares relevant strategies on how to authentically document children's learning and development, particularly in regards to formative and summative assessment. The use of pedagogical narration and documentation as a way to create and support a responsive curriculum for young children will also be collaboratively and critically discussed.

ECED 425A

TEACHERS AS RESEARCHERS: FIELD BASED INQUIRY **IN ECE CLASSROOMS**

This course enables educators to pursue their own inquiry based questions in relation to relevant issues in early childhood education. Students can pursue questions individually or in collaborative inquiry groups.

ECED 425B

CONTEMPORARY CHILDHOOD IN A DIGITAL WORLD

This course explores the diverse ways young children can engage in meaningful and productive learning experiences with a range of technological tools. Providing children with guidance and support as they interact with technology will be the focus of this course. We will also explore how children can utilize technology in ways that they can be active contributors in a globalized and digital world.

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
