PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Educational leadership is a situated ethical practice, typically involving multiple constituencies that may hold conflicting social, political, and cultural views.

The M.Ed. program at EDST is founded on three core courses that are intended to open conversations about what counts as education (EDST 581), how schooling is organized (EDST 582), and how educational agency or leadership might be exercised in schools (EDST 532).

Additionally, a capstone research course and graduating paper provide an opportunity for students to study their own practices, while four elective courses allow students to explore educational leadership issues from a wide range of viewpoints.
