M.ED. IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION & LEADERSHIP



Educational leadership is a situated ethical practice, typically involving multiple constituencies that may hold conflicting social, political, and cultural views.

The M.Ed. program with EDST is founded on three core courses that are intended to open conversations about what counts as education (EDST 581), how schooling is organized (EDST 582), and how educational agency or leadership might be exercised in schools, districts and community (EDST 532).

Additionally, a capstone research course and graduating paper provide an opportunity for students to study their own practices, while four elective courses allow students to explore educational leadership issues from a wide range of viewpoints.

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APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ A minimum of three years full-time teaching experience or an equivalent combination of engagement within schools, communities, non-governmental organizations, or other education-oriented environments.
- ▶ A completed four-year undergraduate degree and at least a 76% average on all senior-level credits.
- ▶ Three recommendations from educators and administrators that speak to your engagement with education and leadership.
- ▶ Resumé and a 600-word statement of intent of your educational leadership experience (regardless of your formal position) and your professional goals and the way in which you believe this program would link to them.

The UBC M.Ed. in Educational Administration & Leadership consists of 30 credits of course work, which are typically completed in two years.
