APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

All students must meet the following requirements:

- A completed three- or four-year undergraduate degree
- Minimum GPA of 76% average on all senior-level credits
- Appropriate background in Teaching English as a Second Language, which includes at least 18 credits of relevant senior coursework
- Two years full-time teaching experience, or an equivalent combination of engagements within education-oriented environments
- A CV (resumé)
- Three letters of recommendation
- A 500-word statement of intent
