This Master of Education is a program that braids together social justice, ecological justice, eco and other technologies, Indigeneity, arts, social media, activism, and place-based experiential learning.

Ecojustice focuses on the possibilities of a green world, as well as just world.

Sustainability refers to ecological, cultural, community and economic sustainability.

Indigeneity includes the complex and diverse contexts and lived experiences of Indigenous and land-based peoples worldwide in an era of climate change.

Students will have an opportunity to:

- Examine the multiple and complex relations between humans, non-humans, and the natural world in local and global contexts;
- Engage in critical analysis of dominant power structures;
- Explore ways to encourage transformative social change and action that promote sustainability in places of learning, organizations, workplaces and communities;
- Increase their capacity to respond to local and global environmental issues.
